balance plays significant role in the pathophysiological reactions of the severe injury response processes. The more detailed study of pathophysiological processes that develops during traumatic disease can help for predicting patient survival and development of possible complications in patients with combined thoracic trauma.

FORMATION OF LEGAL BASICS IN PROVIDING OF DENTAL SERVICES

To ensure the constitutional right of citizens to health and health care in today social economic conditions is extremely difficult. This aspect remains acute in dental care provision as well.

Today, when social life becomes more democratic and market relations continue to evolve, relations between a service providing institution and a patient apparently become civil by nature and, therefore, should be characterized by equality of the both parties. Civilized approach to dental services provision assumes that any medical (dental) service is aimed at meeting a patient's needs. The modern national science proclaims the principle of an individual approach to each patient. Therefore, in medical service sphere, still maintaining a market-based approach, compliance with a principle of humanism and high moral standards for doctors remain of the highest importance. Given that between physicians, dentists in particular, there is constant competition in their struggle for profit, there is an acute necessity for moral and legal regulation of relations at the same time. Taking into account that the principle of freedom of activity is being realized in professional competition, we still have to mention that a market-based approach in dentist services sphere bears a risk of neglect and disregard of the medical ethics provisions and moral norms demands.

Dental service is а form ofprofessional medical services focused on human health. The analysis of nature and structure of the "dental service" concept reveals complicated interpersonal relations of different level: between doctor and patient, between doctors, between doctor supporting staff, between supporting staff and patient etc. This sophisticated structure requires putting a human to the leading position in relations, and in this way implement high principles of humanism, ethics and professionalism of a physician.

I have to underline, that at early stages of training for dentists it is of vital importance to focus on legal and ethical aspects in medical practice. An appropriate and correct relation between doctor and patient is an important scientific and pedagogical problem of medicine.
