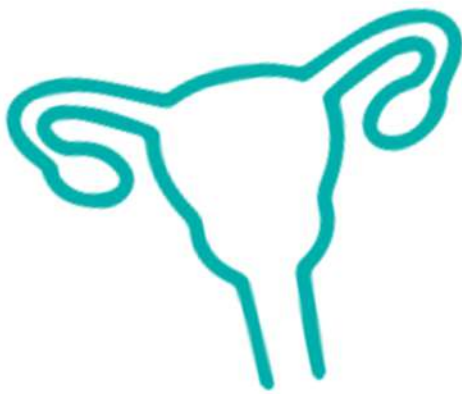

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OUTCOMES OF SUBSEQUENT PREGNANCIES AFTER SURGICAL DELIVERY

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Actuality. A Caesarean section and its complications play a great role in the practice of Obstetrics. In Ukraine, the frequency of prompt resolution is 15 to 26% of all births.

Objective: To study the course of pregnancy and subsequent childbirth in women, in the history of which the first pregnancy ended with a cesarean section.

Materials and methods: The surveyed women were divided into 2 groups, the main and control. The main group included 26 women with complicated pregnancy that ended in caesarean section. The control group consisted of 22 women with normal pregnancy and childbirth.

In the main group there were somatic pathologies: 2 women with diabetes mellitus, 9 - with hypertension, 2 - with asthma. In anamnesis, 11 women had obstetric complications, such as miscarriage, ectopic pregnancy. 7 women had gynecological diseases: inflammation of the appendages, ovarian cyst.

Results: During pregnancy, women with a history of cesarean section had complications: placenta previa -3, abnormal fetal position -4, postpartum hemorrhage -3, weakness of labor -5, 1 patient with placenta accreta.

Conclusions: Women with a history of caesarean section have a greater risk of complications in subsequent pregnancies.



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
